Daily Monitoring		
Excessive thirst (drinking more water than usual) Frequent urination or accidents indoors Increased hunger without weight gain Lethargy or reduced energy		
Weekly Monitoring		
Unexplained weight loss Dull coat or skin issues Bad breath (fruity or acetone-like odor) Signs of urinary tract infections (e.g., straining)		
Monthly Monitoring		
Cloudy eyes or vision changes (possible cataracts) Weakness in hind legs or wobbling Slow-healing wounds or frequent infections Behavioral changes (e.g., confusion, irritability)
